Alex De Vinny Memorial Fund **Awards Grant To NIS**

In the company of such organizations as Duke University Medical Center and The National Eating Disorder Association, NIS was awarded a grant by the Alex DeVinny Memorial Fund in January. A great source of inspiration for TEAM NORMAL (a program to educate athletes about the epidemic of eating disorders in sports communities), Alex died four years ago (this March) at the age of 20 after a notable amateur athletic career that included a state title in track. Alex lost her battle to anorexia nervosa, which, according to the National Institute of Mental Health, has the highest premature mortality rate of any psychiatric disorder. The Alex DeVinny Memorial Fund was established to honor Alex's life, to expand public understanding of and the prevention of eating disorders, and to promote sound research for those affected and their families. The grant is awarded to NIS to further its mission of educating and reducing stigma about eating disorders in schools and communities nationwide.
